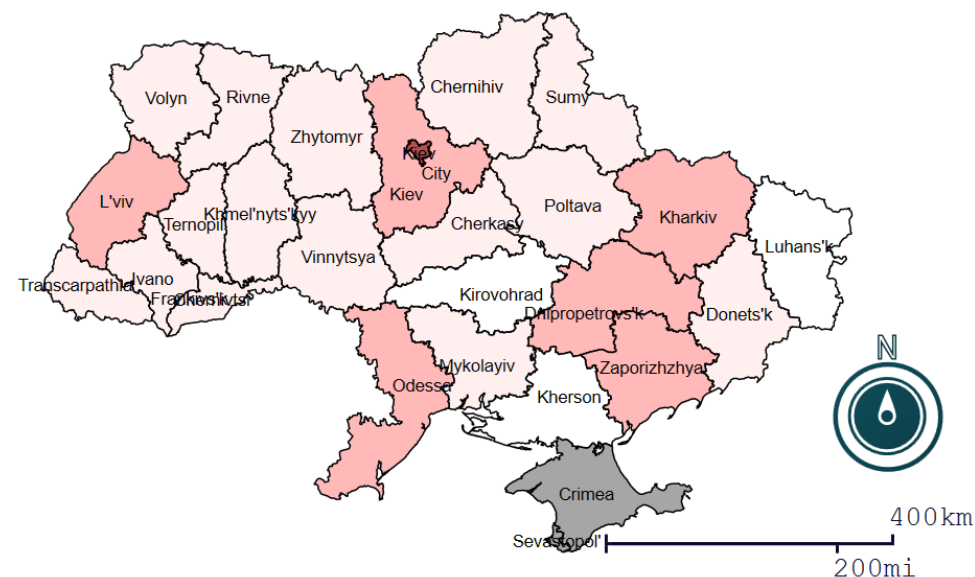

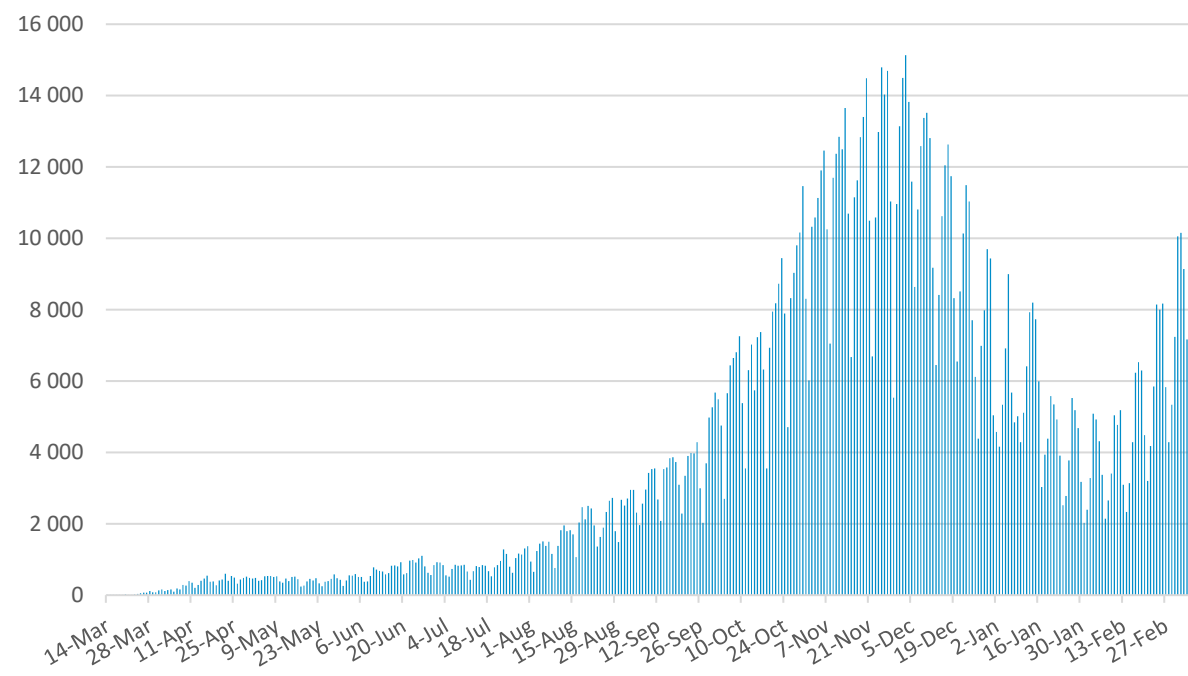

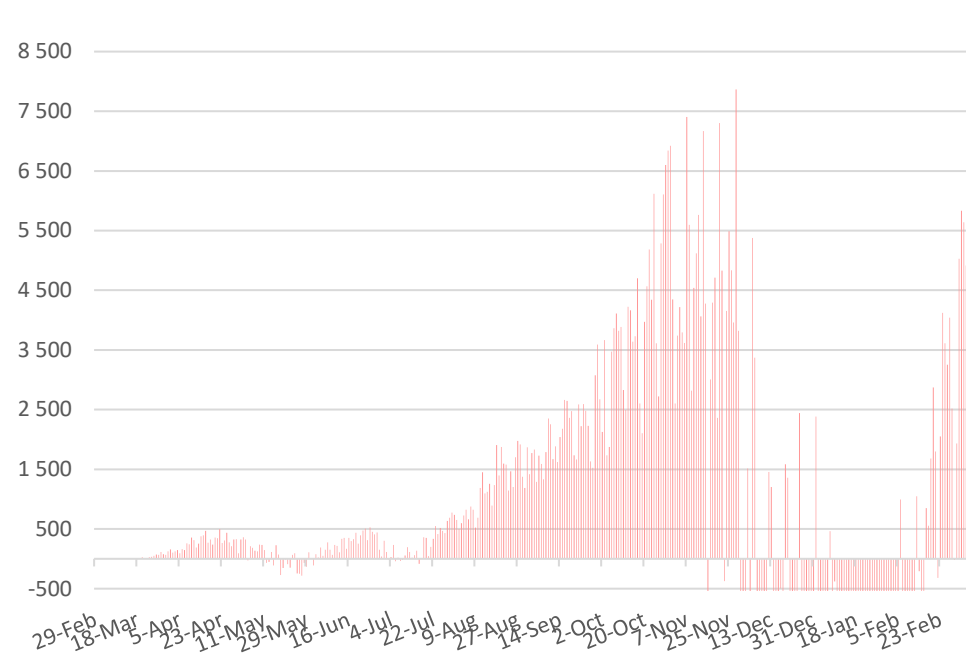

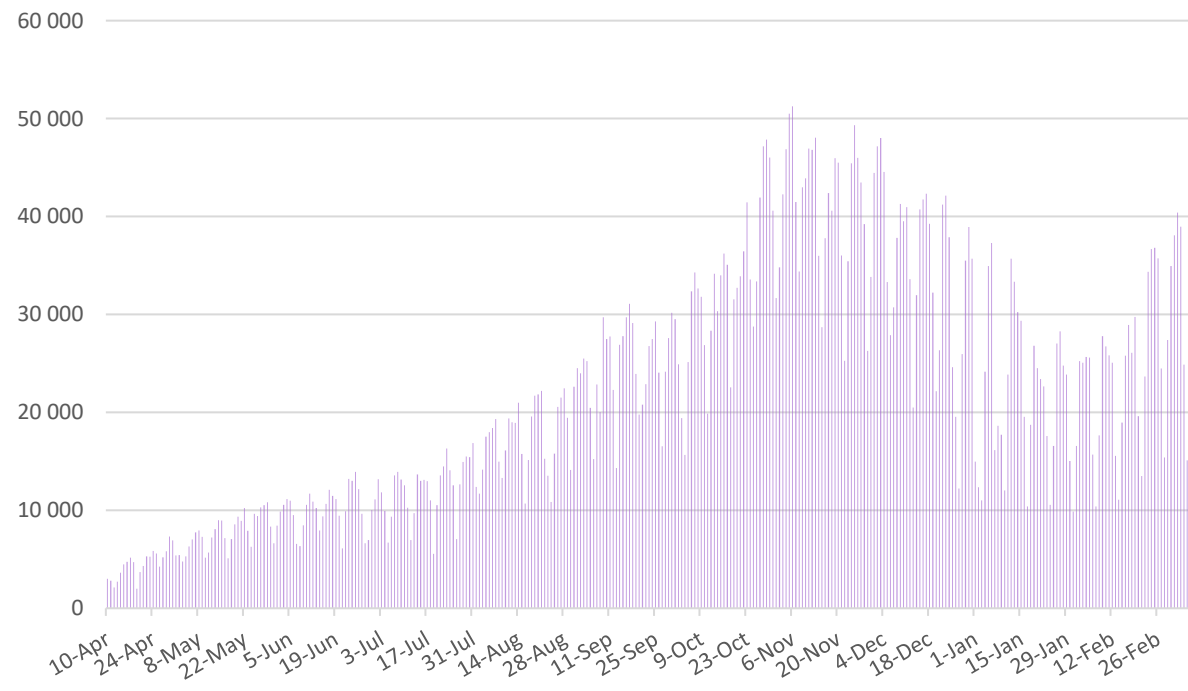
Confirmed cases by date of reporting



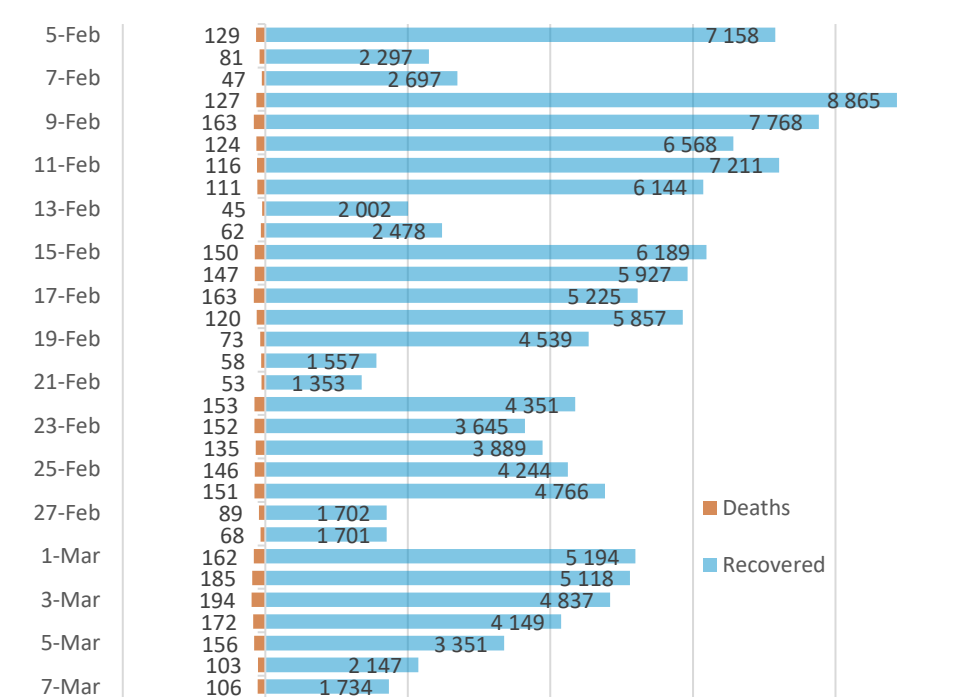
Active cases per day



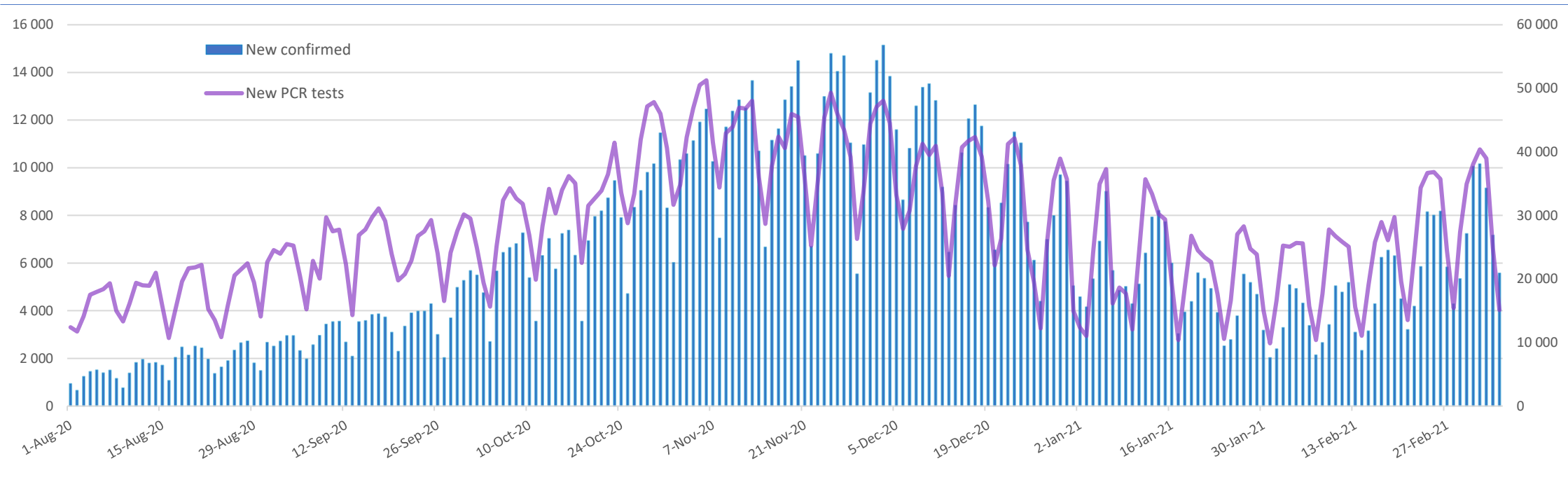
Conducted PCR tests



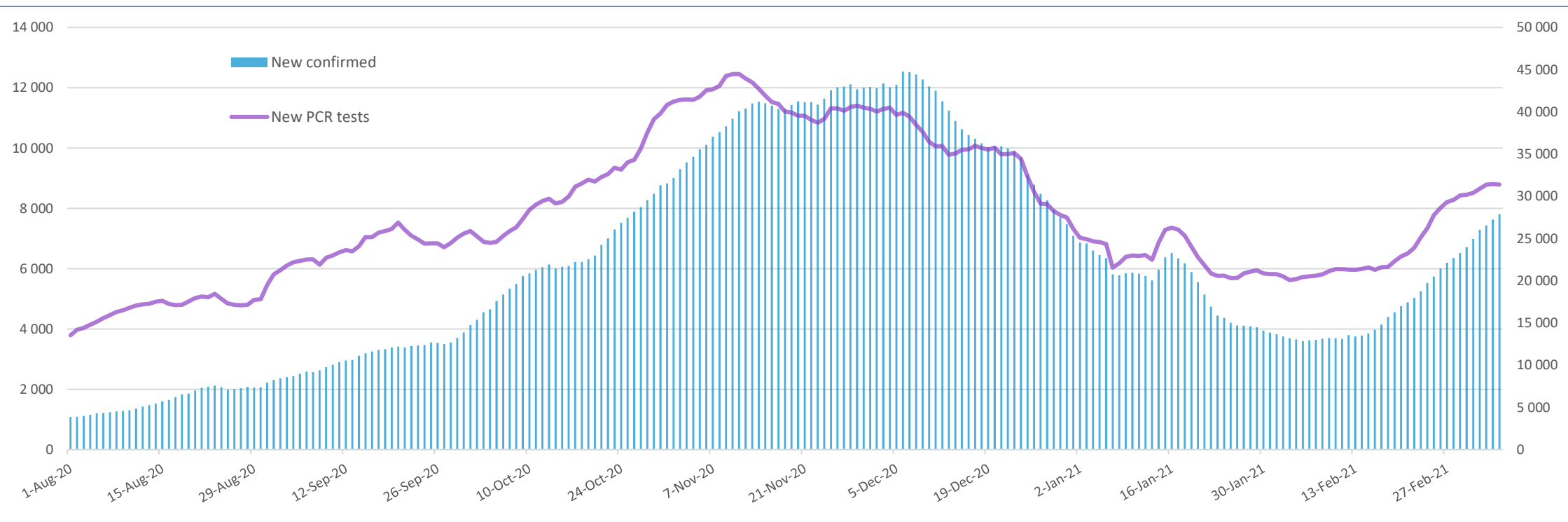
Lethal and recovered cases

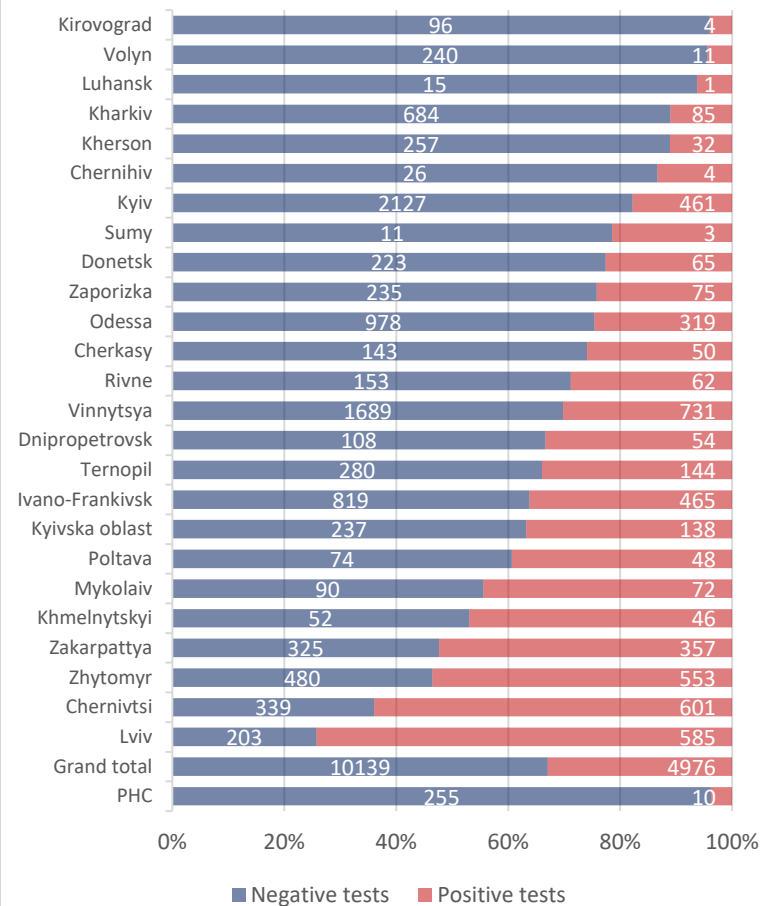

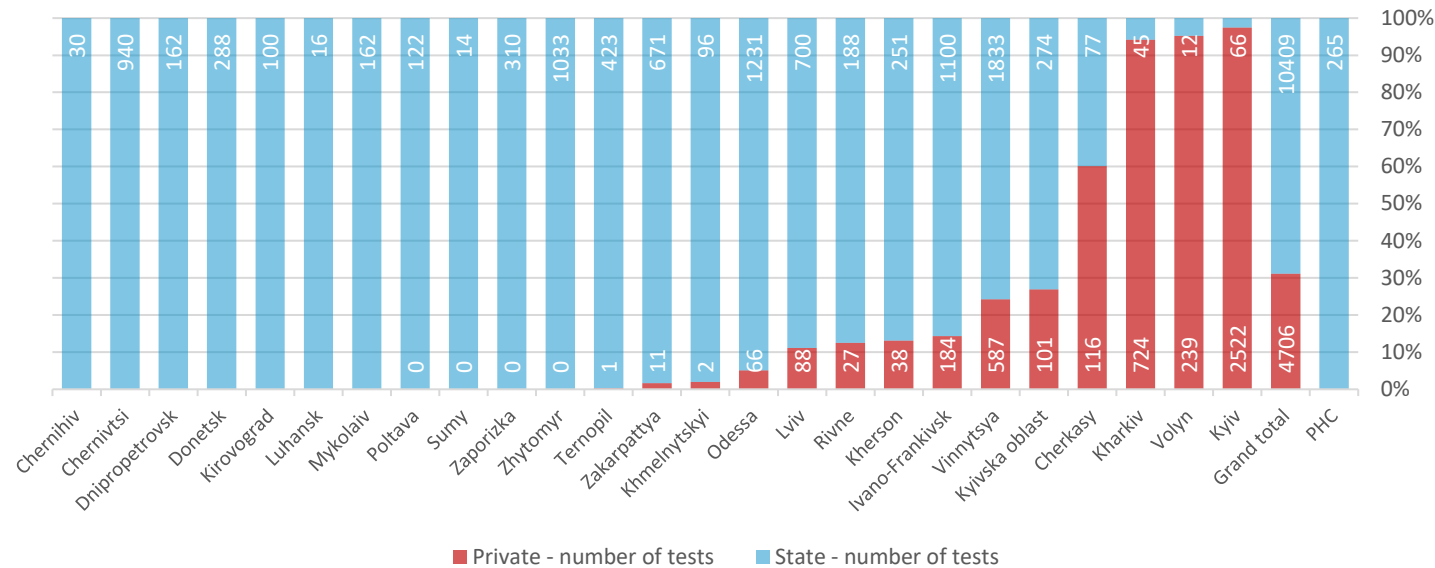

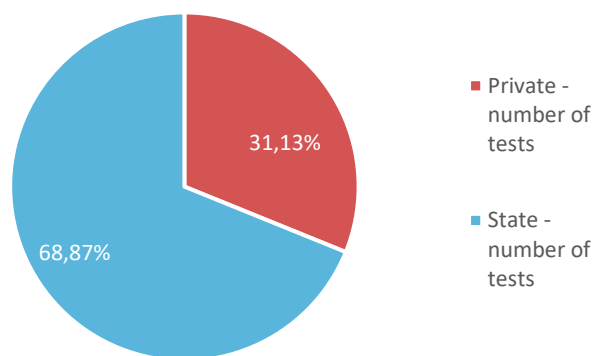
## Number of positive\* and negative results



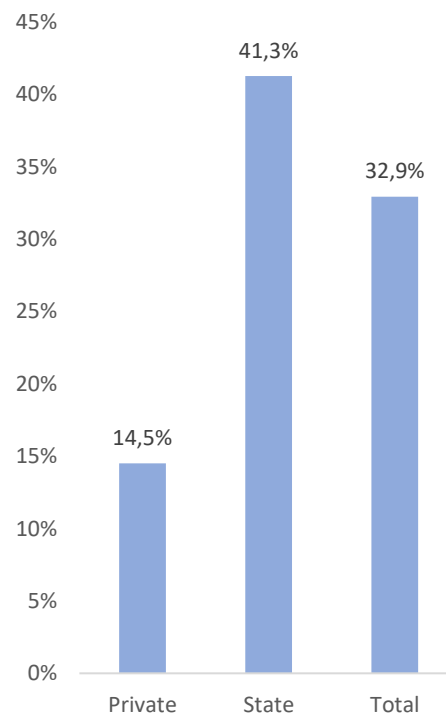
## Share of tests done in private and state labs



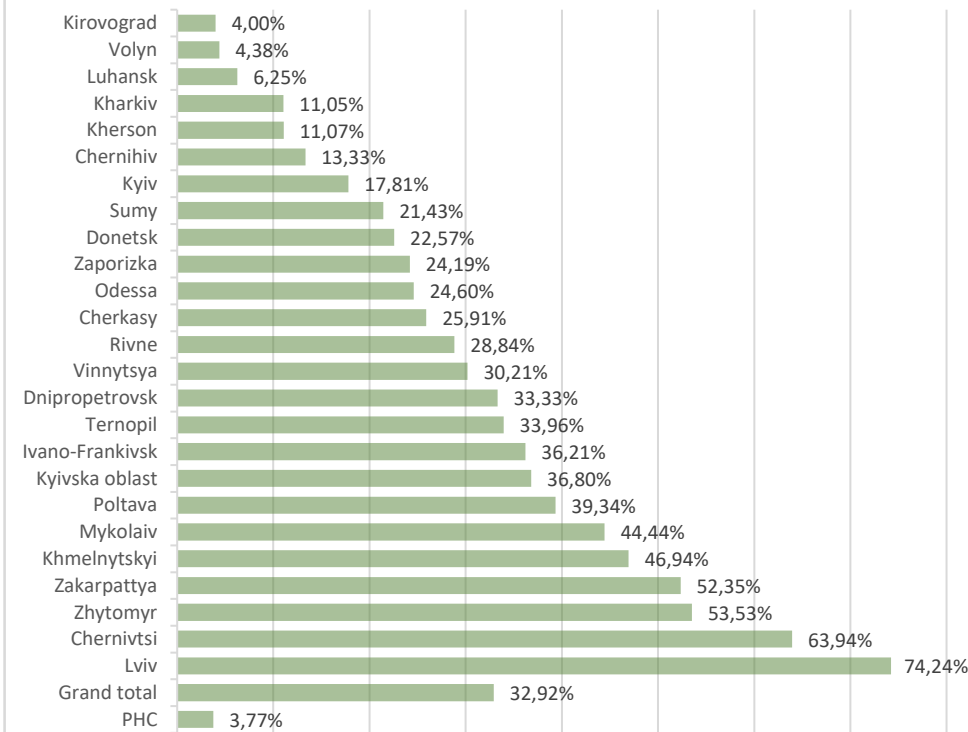

## Positivity rate in private and state labs

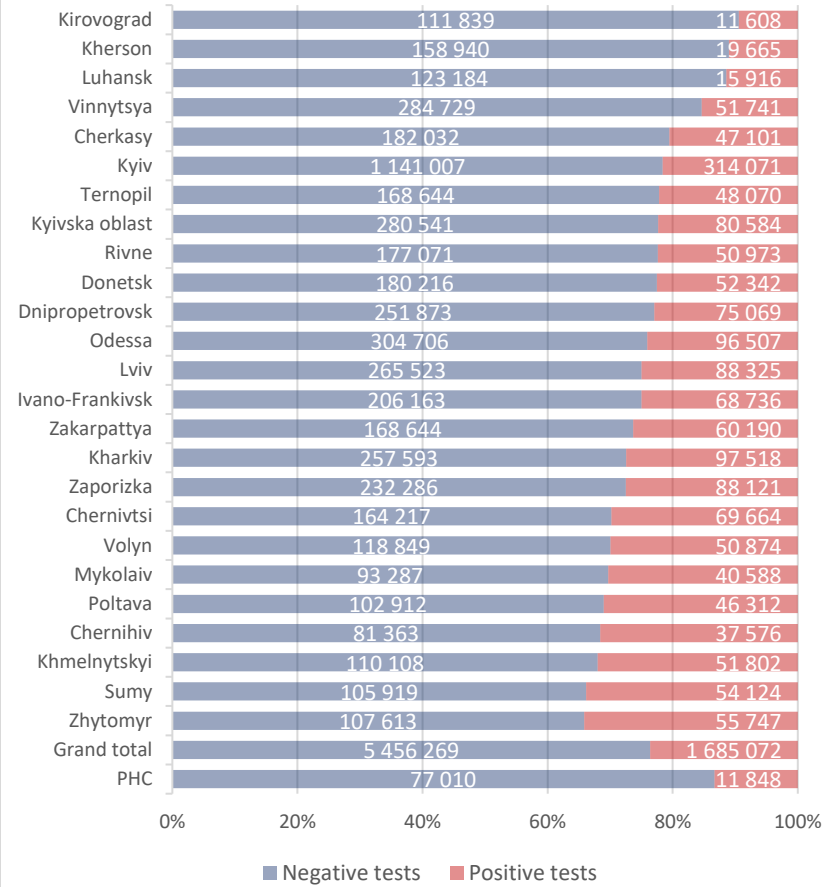

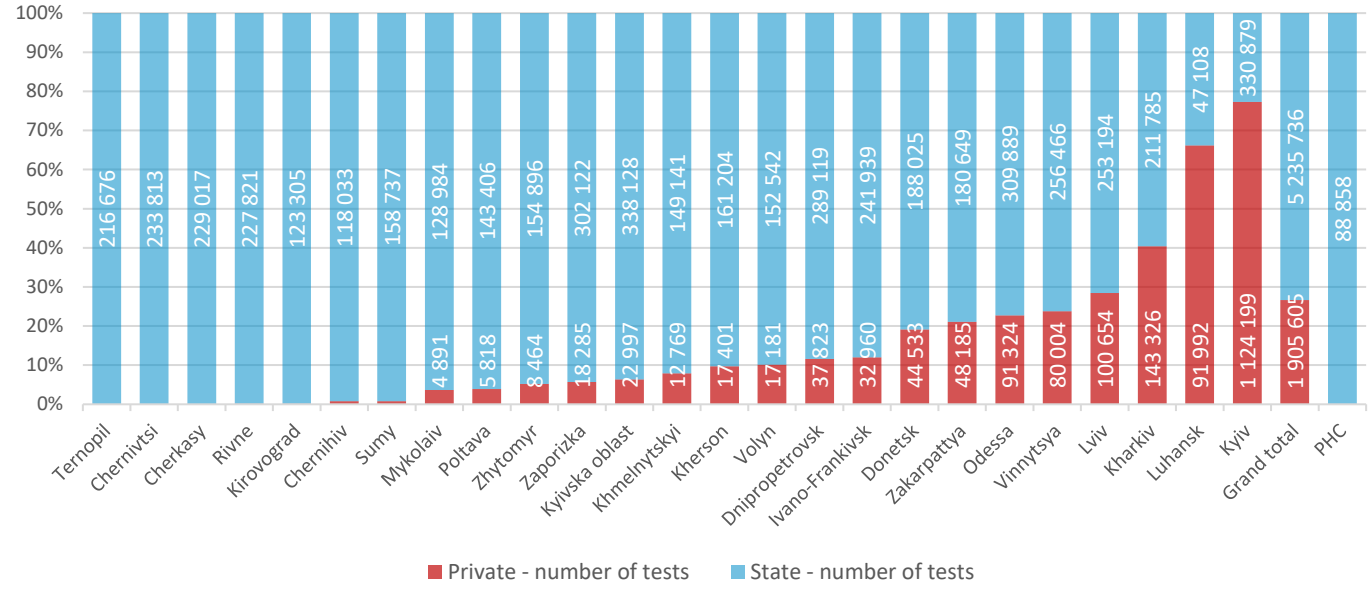

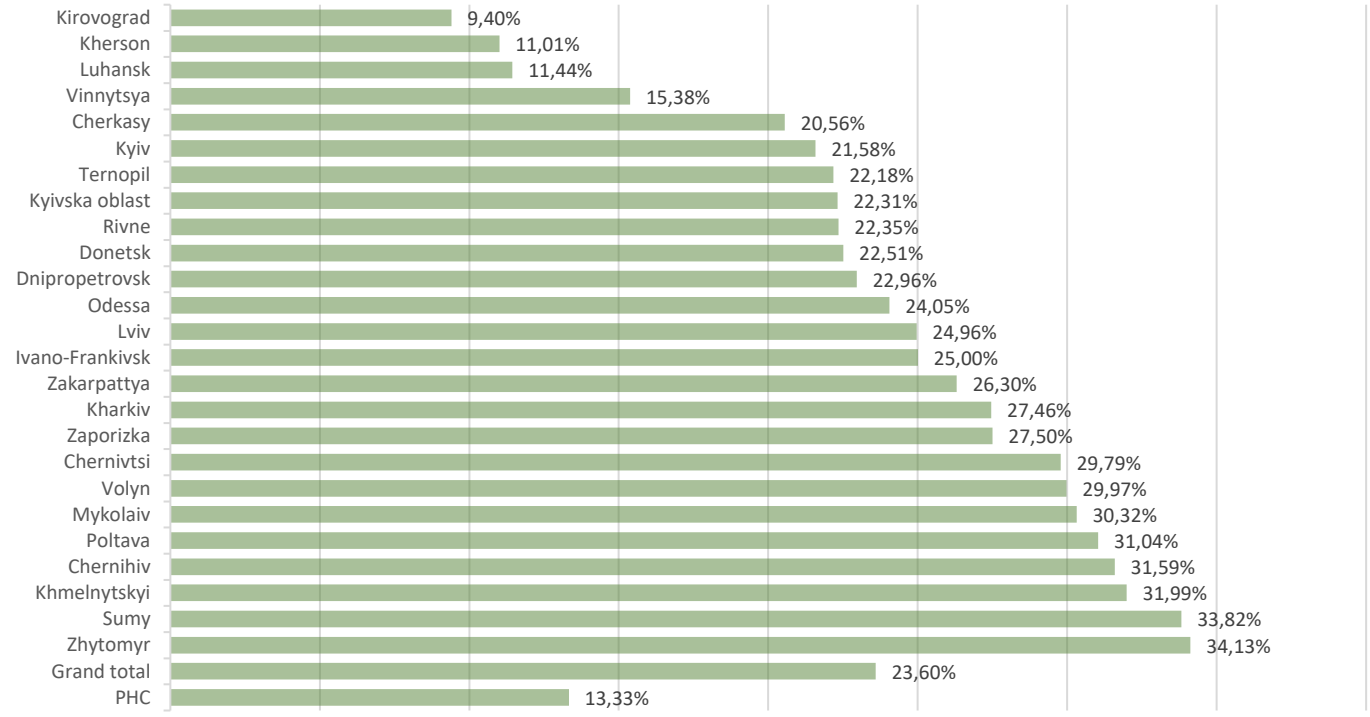

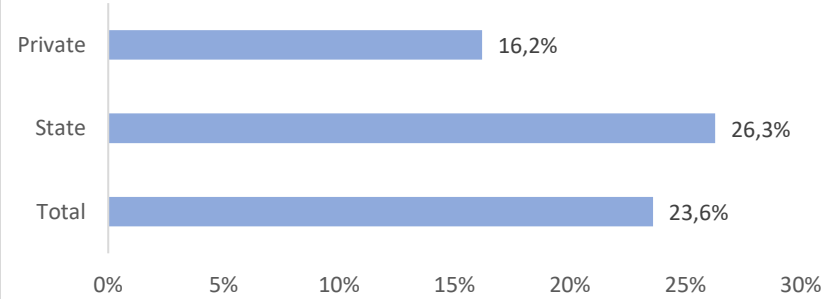
Share of tests done in private and state labs



Percent of positive result

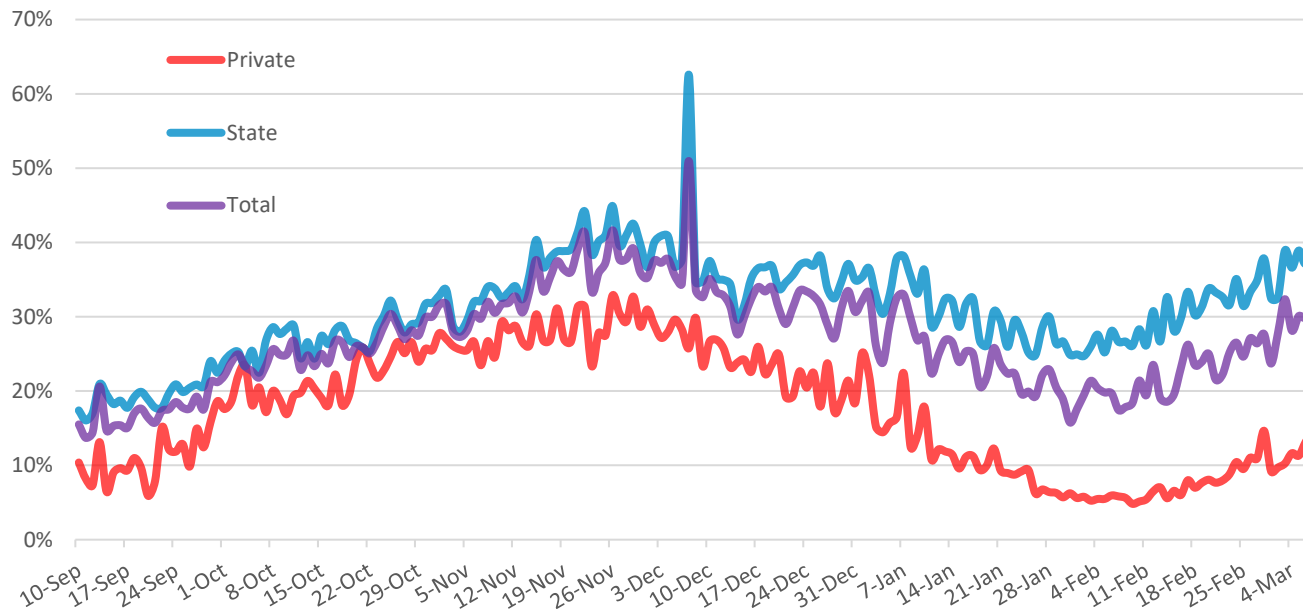


Positivity rate in private and state labs

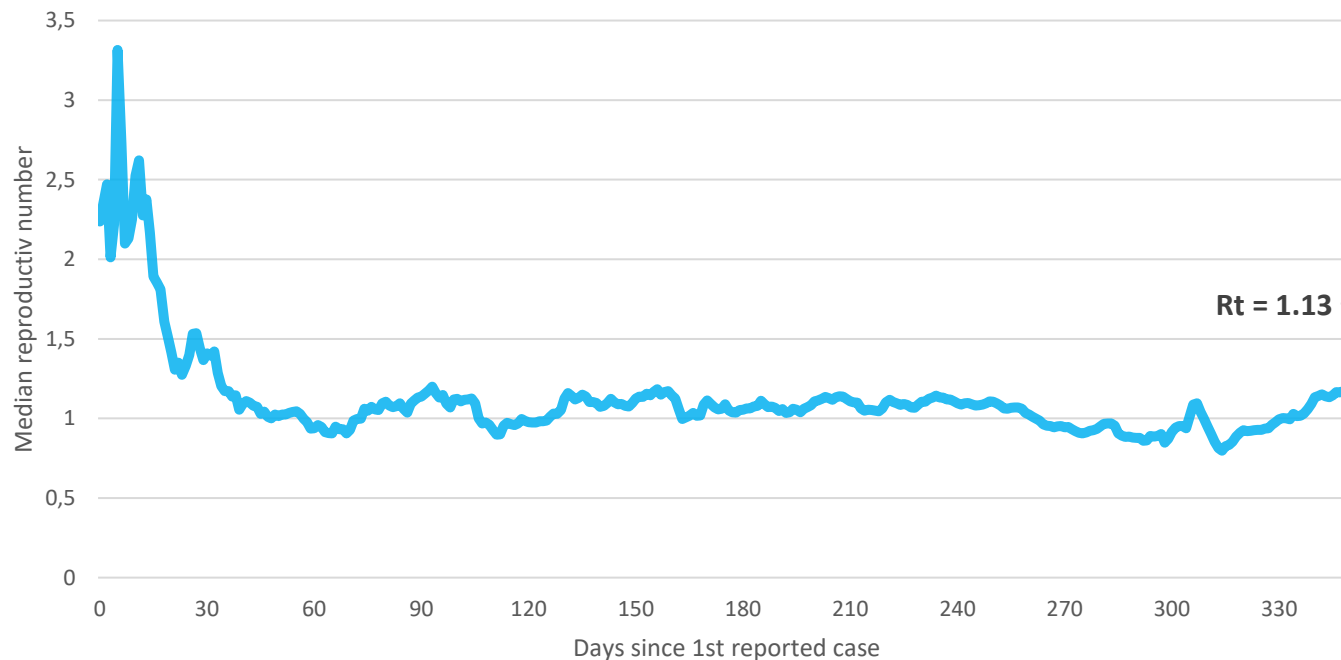

## Latest measures of the government

- [Two mutated strains of coronavirus with genetic characteristics corresponding to the British variant](#) were found in Ukraine.
- In the year since the first case of coronavirus was recorded in Ukraine, [542 medical facilities across the country have been repurposed to treat patients with COVID-19. The number of beds has been increased from 12,700 to 69,500. 59,471 of them are supplied with oxygen, while a year ago there were only 3,400.](#)
- [Ukraine has received new vaccines that are intended for routine vaccination.](#)
- [The Ministry of Health will provide additional payments to the salaries of laboratory staff](#) and will allocate additional funds to pay for medical services related to vaccination.
- [100,000 Ukrainians signed up for the COVID-19 vaccination](#) through the “Dija” online-service.
- The government introduced a website containing information about COVID-19 vaccination in Ukraine - [Все про вакцинацію \(covid19.gov.ua\).](#)
