#### Source of the data:

Primarily The Swedish Deathbooks 8-9, sourced from Statistics Sweden (SCB). The Swedish Tax Agency (Skatteverket) was consulted for some deaths after 2022. The Swedish national archives (Riksarkivet), Ancestry.com, Arkivdigital.se and corresponding archives from other countries were used for documentation.

### Age validation process:

For supercentenarians: full age validation and family tree reconstruction.

**For Nordic-born semi-supercentenarians:** Checking birth, marriage (if available), death info and confirming identity (e.g., matching place of birth from death register with place of birth etc.).

**For semi-supercentenarians born outside Northern countries:** birth documentation generally not located. Some moved to Sweden rather early in life and are therefore included as they are in either early parish rolls, marriage records, or the mental lengths (a version of a census for population count purposes). These are marked as "ONLY LATER LIFE"

A few known alleged supercentenarians and semi-supercentenarians are excluded from this list due to lack of any documentation or where there exist hints to their ages being exaggerated. Especially ones where they are disputed or come from regions without public records.

General source for validation is the Swedish death books based on information from the Swedish tax agency. People who died after 2022 are based on personal knowledge through person lookup websites.
