Abstract

DEMOSTAF brings together Research institutes and National statistics offices (NSOs) in a staff exchange programme with the aim to advance research on population issues in Sub-Saharan Africa. Four major themes federate the research projects that aim to shed light on key contemporaneous questions which are part of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The programme focuses on the articulation between quantitative data from national statistics and local data. Thanks to the close involvement of NSOs, the programme will consolidate and promote public statistics. From 2016 to 2019, the programme will fund staff mobility between 18 institutions for supporting research projects, while reinforcing training and skill transfers. Collective activities essentially devoted to training, data documentation and scientific dissemination are also planned. In total, almost a hundred of individuals participate in the projet. Among them 74 researchers, statisticians, PhD students and librarians are involved in 193 months of international secondments.

Scientific workshop, May 31 2016

Focus on... the first activities of June related to the WP4 "Families and households"

The first secondments associated with collective activities took place just after the kick-off meeting, in order to benefit in the first days of the simultaneous presence of the participants, institutional representatives and scientific coordinators.

WP4 is built around the use of census data from Burkina Faso (2006), Mali (2009) and Senegal (2013). It has several important methodological challenges: data comparability among the three countries, production of indicators at the local level, construction of indicators at the household level and formalization of maps. The purpose of the workshops organized in June was to work on the comparability of census data from Burkina Faso, Mali and Senegal (household definition, concepts, variables) and on the construction of indicators that could ensure continuity analysis across countries. The team had to identify the data limitations, their national specific characteristics and the features to expand for harmonization. The statisticians from the three countries were together mobilized in learning and implementation of mapping software to produce thematic maps on household structures. Moreover, exchanges were pursued on scientific direction of the project and collaborations. Scientific presentations were also organized.
